Sue Wilson and her staff, with the support of Children and Families of Iowa as well as local businesses and volunteers, made the program possible. WeLIFT also obtained a grant from Future Ready Iowa for about \$43,000. Beside providing space for the program, Trinity also contributed by providing lunch for the participants, thanks to Betty Dyer and Kerry McKasson.

The Record Herald article made us stop and consider the many ways Trinity members live our faith by reaching out to help others. Among these are Helping Hand, Heal House, our sister parish in El Salvador, quilts made by Trinity's Tuesday Stitchers, Habitat for Humanity, Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA), the Coalition of Immokalee Workers, Open Table, Meals from the Heartland; the list goes on. These are all examples of Trinity reaching outside our congregation, striving to live the example of Jesus. We should be proud, not prideful, AND always willing to continue to be a giving, serving congregation. Hold that thought until the stewardship campaign!

Update from Session...

We know there are many questions on 'what is happening' to find our next pastor. When the Commission on Ministry gives the approval, Session will begin the process of electing a Pastor Nominating Committee. Session will decide on the number of members and makeup of the PNC (such as current elder/deacon, staff member, at-large member). With those decisions, the new Nominating Committee will start looking for PNC members. When potential members have been found, a congregational meeting will be called to elect the PNC. Rev. Ian McMullen will train and advise the PNC members through the process. There is no estimated timeframe for this.

We do expect to start the search for a transitional (interim) pastor soon. In the meantime, we will continue to have pulpit supply on Sundays. At this time, we are scheduling guest speakers into October. Though we don't have definitive answers, please feel free to ask questions and share your comments with us and continue to keep Trinity and our next pastor in your prayers.

Trees, Trees. While Trinity does not have the land for trees, trees are a vital part of the world. Perhaps you know a perfect place for a tree.

- 1. **Trees increase property values.** In fact, landscaping with trees and other plants can add as much as 20% to the value of your property. What a great return on your investment!
- 2. **Trees clean the air.** Each tree can take in as much as 48 pounds of carbon dioxide yearly and can sequester 1 ton by the time the tree is 40 years old. Trees also absorb odors and other gases such as ammonia and sulfur dioxins. Particulates are trapped by tree leaves and bark.
- 3. **Trees slow water runoff.** Flash flooding can be significantly reduced. For example, a Colorado blue spruce can intercept 1,000 gallons of water annually. This also helps to recharge aquifers.
- 4. Trees prevent soil erosion. The tree roots bind the soil, and a tree's leaves provide a barrier to the wind and rain.
- 5. **Trees cool our homes, streets and cities.** Trees can cool a city by up to 10 degrees Fahrenheit by shading homes and streets. This breaks up "heat islands" and releases water vapor through the air. In turn, you can save up to 25% on energy bills.

The list goes on, describing how planting trees is a plus for all of us. Give it a try if you can.
